

A SMILE COSTS NOTHING... EXCEPT IN SANDYCOVE WHERE IT WILL SET YOU BACK €650!

- The cheapest average price for dental consultations in the country is in Co.
 Westmeath (€28); the most expensive in Co. Cork (€64)
- Extractions will set you back just €50 in Co. Cavan but almost double that in Co.
 Carlow (€93)
- Teeth whitening in Co. Kerry costs an average of €388, more than double that of Co. Westmeath (€159)
- Most expensive consultation in the country is in Westport (€160); cheapest can be found in Limerick (€10)

Tuesday 19 August 2014 – The county you live in greatly affects how much you will pay for dental care in Ireland, according to new research from private healthcare search engine, WhatClinic.com.

The average cost of a dental consultation in Ireland is €45, however, residents in Co. Meath will enjoy much more favourable rates, as an average check-up there costs just €28, whereas appointments in Co. Cork will set patients back €64. The most expensive check-up was found at a Westport clinic. At a staggering €160, a check-up there is 16 times the price of the cheapest, found in Limerick and costing just €10.

Across Ireland, the average cost of teeth whitening is €262, but for the best value for money people should head to Co. Westmeath where it costs just €159. Co. Kerry, at €388, is the most expensive county for pearly whites, at more than double that of Co. Westmeath. However, one clinic in Sandycove charges patients more than €650 for the treatment.



The average cost of teeth cleaning in Ireland is €55, but patients in Co. Donegal will pay just €38, while those in Co. Kerry will pay €64. Patients looking to snap up a bargain smile should head to Foxrock where the treatment costs as little as €17, but avoid Dublin's city centre where the same treatment can set you back up to €150. The country has seen a 68% rise in people enquiring about teeth cleaning appointments, although the biggest increase has been in Co. Kildare where they have more than tripled (229%).

Teeth extractions in Ireland cost €76 on average, but vary up to €180 between clinics. The best value extractions are in Co. Cavan at €50 and the most expensive in Co. Carlow (€93) on average.

The much-feared filling costs an average €72 across Ireland but can be much less painful in North Dublin, at €24, or an excruciatingly expensive €147 in Ballsbridge.
